Budget Process Update

I've now had individual one on one's with all council members, and we are working internally to finalize the draft budget. We are still on track for circulating an initial draft by mid to late next week, and we're looking forward to beginning the budget presentation process at the next council meeting!

Fair Avenue Median Refresh

Thanks to the generous support of the Bexley Community Foundation, we are moving forward with plans to refresh and refine the iconic medians on Fair Avenue, elevating both their visual appeal and their environmental importance.

The new landscaping will reinforce the beautiful, established red oak trees by adding more than a dozen varieties of other native oak species. With this expansion of species in the median, we will be creating a quercetum, an arboretum of oaks, and we're very pleased to share that this arboretum will be named the Susan Quintenz Quercetum in honor of the many years of advocacy, leadership, and service Susan has contributed to Bexley's trees. In the coming weeks, keep an eye out for median work, which will include:

- Removal of failing or dead trees and plant material
- Installation of oaks trees, dogwoods, and other new plants
- Signage installation to identify the native oak species

As a note, the median at Cassingham and Fair was recently planted with a variety of shrubs and perennials to visually highlight this intersection, but the remainder of the Fair Avenue medians will remain lawn.
