An ordinance - Declaring it necessary and determining to proceed to construct certain of the sanitary sewers shown on the general plan of sewerage heretofore adopted for the village of Bexley, Ohio.

WHEREAS, at a general election held in the village of Bexley, Franklin County, Ohio, on the 7th day of November, 1916, the question of issuing the bonds of said village in an amount in excess of two and one-half per cent. (2½%) of the total value of all the property in said village, as listed and assessed for taxation, that is, in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for the purpose of paying the costs and expense of constructing sanitary sewers in said village, was submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of said village; and

WHEREAS, two-thirds ( $\frac{2}{3}$ ) of the voters voting at such election upon the question of issuing said bonds voted in favor thereof; and

WHEREAS, the council of said village, on the 12th day of December, 1916, pursuant to said resolution and vote, duly passed an ordinance No. 135 authorizing the issue and sale of the bonds aforesaid in said sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and thereby appropriated the proceeds from the sale of said bonds, except the premium and accrued interest to the payment of the cost of constructing sanitary sewers in said village;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the council of the village of Bexley, state of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is deemed necessary and it hereby is determined to proceed to construct a certain part of the sanitary sewers provided for in a general plan for a system of sewerage for said village, which general plan was adopted by the council of said village on the 28th day of March, 1916, and is now on file in the office of the clerk of said village, to-wit:

In Drexel Avenue from Dale Avenue to a point one hundred feet south of the south line of Broad Street; in north Commonwealth Avenue from the east line of Parkview Avenue to a point three hundred and twenty (320) feet east thereof, and from the sewer in Columbia Avenue to a point two hundred and sixty-six (266) feet east thereof; also a sewer in Mound Street from the sewer in Pleasant Ridge Avenue to a point five hundred feet east thereof, which last named sewer is not shown on said general plan.

Section 2. That said sewers shall be constructed of vitrified sewer pipe and in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the clerk of said village.

Section 3. That the whole cost of constructing said sewers and any and all necessary expenses connected therewith shall be paid by said village out of the proceeds of the sale of bonds authorized to be issued as aforesaid and appropriated for such purpose as aforesaid.

Section 4. That the clerk be and hereby is authorized to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
