

Resolution #726

Declaring it necessary to construct a part of the sanitary sewers shown on the plan of Sewer District No 4

Be it resolved by the Council of the Village of Berley Wis.:

That it is necessary to construct a certain part of the sanitary sewers provided for in an amended plan of sewer districts in said village named and designated as Sewer District No 4 which amended plan was duly adopted by the Council on the 15th day of March 1921, and is now on file in the office of the Clerk of said village, and that the portion of the work provided for in said general plan hereby determined to construct is as follows:

Commencing at the main sewer in said District No 4 where it intersects the first alley south of Astor Avenue in said village thence easterly in said alley to the alley between Sinclair Avenue and Berley Plaza; thence northerly in the alley between Sinclair Avenue and Berley Plaza to the first alley south of Main Street; thence easterly in the first alley south of Main Street to the east curb line of Pentz Avenue.

Be it further resolved that said sewers shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the Clerk of said village and shall be of vitrified sewer pipe.

Be it further resolved that the whole cost of said improvement less one-fiftieth thereof shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to wit: all lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement which said lots are hereby determined to be especially benefited by said improvement.

Be it resolved further that assessment as to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments with interest on deferred payments at six per cent (6%) per annum.

Be it resolved further that bonds of the Village of Berley shall be raised in anticipation of the collection by installments and an account equal thereto.

Be it resolved further that the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement not especially assessed shall be paid out of the general fund of said village. Be it resolved further that the Clerk be and hereby is directed to cause this resolution to be published in the manner provided by law.

RESOLUTION No. 228.

Declaring it necessary to construct a part of the sanitary sewers shown on the plan of Sewer District No. 4.

Be it resolved by the council of the Village of Bexley, Ohio:

That it is necessary to construct a certain part of the sanitary sewers provided for in an amended plan of sewer districts in said village named and designated as Sewer District No. 4, which amended plan was duly adopted by the council on the 15th day of March, 1921, and is now on file in the office of the clerk of said village, and that the portion of the work provided for in said general plan hereby determined to construct is as follows:

Commencing at the main sewer in said District No. 4 where it intersects the first alley south of Astor Avenue in said village; thence easterly in said alley to the alley between Euclaire Avenue and Bexley Avenue; thence northerly in the alley between Euclaire Avenue and Bexley Avenue to the first alley south of Main Street; thence easterly in the first alley south of Main Street to the east curb line of Center Avenue.

Be It Further Resolved, That said sewers shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the clerk of said village and shall be of vitrified sewer pipe.

Be It Further Resolved, That the whole cost of said improvement less one-fiftieth thereof shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement which said lots are hereby determined to be especially benefited by said improvement.

Be It Resolved Further, That assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments with interest on deferred payments at six per cent (6%) per annum.

Be It Resolved Further, That bonds of the Village of Bexley shall be issued in anticipation of the collection by installments and in an amount equal thereto.

Be It Resolved Further, That the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement, not especially assessed shall be paid out of the sewer fund of said village.

Be It Resolved Further, That the clerk be and hereby is directed to cause this resolution to be published in the manner provided by law.
