Declaring the necessity to improve Plymouth Avenue from Dawson Avenue to Passady Avenue.

Whereas, the owners of more than three-fourths of the property fronting and abutting upon Plymouth Avenue between Dawson Avenue and Passady Avenue, in the village of Bexley, Ohio, have filed their written petition with the council of said village praying such council to pass necessary legislation therefor, and to improve said Plymouth Avenue between the points above named by grading, curbing and paving the roadway with brick, asphalt, bituminous tarria, concrete or some other form of permanent improvement, constructing sewers necessary to furnish proper drainage for such improvement, and making water and sanitary sewer connections to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon, and further praying and consenting that the entire cost of said improvement except such portion thereof as is chargeable by law against said village, be assessed by the foot frontage upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said Plymouth Avenue between said points.

Whereas, said petitioners and each of them consent and request that said assessment be levied or collected without reference to the value of the property of the subscribers and waive all benefits to the statute limiting assessments to thirty-three and one-third per cent ($33\frac{1}{3}\%$) of the actual value of the property assessed.

Now therefore be it resolved between the council of the village of Bexley, state of Ohio:

That it is necessary to improve said Plymouth Avenue from Dawson Avenue to Passady Avenue by grading, curbing and paving the roadway with brick, asphalt, bituminous tarria, concrete or some other form of permanent improvement, constructing sewers necessary to furnish proper drainage for such improvement and making water and sanitary sewer connections from the water main and sanitary sewers in said avenue to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimator and profiles of said proposed improvement prepared by the engineers of said village, which plans, specifications, estimator and profiles are hereby approved and are now on file with the clerk of said village.

Section 2 That the grade of said avenue as improved, shall be as shown on the plan and profile aforesaid and the grade of the curb shall be as follows, to-wit:

North Curb.

Commencing at the east line of Dawson Avenue at Sta. 0 00 and at an elevation of 108.14, thence east with a 0.30% ascending grade to Sta. 200 elevation 108.74; thence with a 0.40% descending grade to the west line of Passady Avenue: Sta. 555.8 elevation 107.32.

South curb:

Same elevation as north curb. Vertical curves to be used at all breaks in the grade. All above elevations are referred to Village datum.

Section 3 That the whole cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth (2%) thereof, and the cost of intersections shall be assessed by the foot frontage upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands abutting and abutting upon said proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are thereby determined to be especially benefited by said improvement, and for an amount equal to the cost thereof.

Section 4 That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in ten equal annual installments with interest on deferred payments, at a rate not exceeding six per cent (6%) per annum.

Section 5 That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments by installments, and in amount equal thereto.

Section 6 That the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement shall be paid by the issue of bonds of said village in the manner provided by law.

7 This resolution to take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
