

Resolution #255 ✓

Declaring intention to appropriate property for street purposes.
Be it resolved by the Council of the Village of Buxley, State of Ohio

That it hereby declares its intention to appropriate for the
purpose of opening and extending Ardmore Avenue to Fair
Avenue, the following described property:

Situated in the Village of Buxley, County of Franklin, State of Ohio,
and being a part of lot number one (1) of J. R. G. & Co. heirs
partition to wit.

First Tract Beginning at a point in the present north line of
Fair Avenue at or about 323.81 feet east of an iron pipe in the
east line of Passady Avenue where it intersects the north line
of said Fair Avenue; thence northerly and parallel to the west
line of said lot one (1) being also the east line of Passady Avenue
one hundred and thirty and sixty hundredths (130.60) feet to a
point in the north line of said lot one (1) thence easterly along
the north line of said lot one (1) fifty (50) feet to a point;
thence southerly and parallel to the west line of said lot one (1)
one hundred and thirty and sixty hundredths (130.60) feet to a stake
in the present north line of Fair Avenue; thence westerly on the
said north line of said avenue to the place of beginning and
being the same premises conveyed to Sumner S. Desper by
Barbara Bleach by deed recorded in Volume 297, Page 555 of
the Franklin County Deed Records.

Second Tract.

Being a strip of ground approximately three (3) feet in width
bounded on the east by the west line of the first tract above described
on the south by the present north line of Fair Avenue, on the
west by the west line of Ardmore Avenue produced southerly to
Fair Avenue and on the north by the south end of Ardmore Avenue
said tract.

Being a strip of ground approximately seven (7) feet in
width bounded on the west by the east line of the first
tract above described, on the south by the present north line of
Fair Avenue, on the east line of Ardmore Avenue produced southerly
to the said north line of Fair Avenue and on the north by the
south end of Ardmore Avenue.
