

## AN ORDINANCE NO. 499.

By Mr. R. J. Wheaton.

To provide for the placing of red lights on obstructions in streets, avenues and alleys in the Village of Bexley, Ohio.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Any person or persons, firm or corporation, placing or causing to be placed any material of any kind or nature in the streets, avenues, or alleys of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, or digging or having dug any trench in said streets, avenues or alleys, shall after sundown display red lights from any such obstruction or trench so as to be plainly seen from all points by any person or persons approaching said obstruction or trench.

Section 2. Any person or persons, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not less than five nor more than ten dollars.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
