

## AN ORDINANCE NO. 519.

By Mr. Wheaton.

To accept deed of Capital University of certain tract of land for the purpose of street and alley extension.

WHEREAS, The Capital University, a corporation not for profit under the laws of Ohio, did on the 4th day of September, 1912, execute its certain quit-claim deed to the Village of Bexley for the following described real estate, to-wit:

Situate in the County of Franklin, State of Ohio, and Village of Bexley:

1st tract. Beginning at a point in the north line of Main Street 1038.10 feet east of the east line of Drexel Avenue; thence northerly on a line parallel with the east line of Drexel Avenue 337.19 feet; thence easterly parallel with the north line of Main Street 32.70 feet; thence southerly parallel with the east line of Drexel Avenue to the north line of Main Street; thence westerly to the beginning.

2nd tract. Beginning at a point in the west line of first tract 161.09 feet north of the north line of Main Street; thence westerly parallel with Main Street 83.30 feet; thence northerly 15 feet parallel with west line of first tract; thence easterly 83.30 feet parallel with the north line of Main Street; thence southerly 15 feet to the beginning,

said deed expressing a consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00), and

WHEREAS, it will be for the best interest of the Village to accept said conveyance, NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEALEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the deed of said The Capital University, bearing date of September 4th, 1912, conveying to the Village of Bexley, Ohio, the above described tract of land for the purpose of street and alley extension as therein mentioned be, and the same is hereby, accepted, and


WHEREAS, said deed has heretofore been recorded upon the records of Franklin County, Ohio, the clerk is hereby directed to certify upon said deed the acceptance thereof by Council and to re-file same for record in the Recorder's Office of Franklin County, Ohio.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
