

## AN ORDINANCE NO. 992.

To narrow a portion of North Drexel Avenue by vacating a strip of ground along the west side thereof.

WHEREAS, on the 12th day of February, 1929, a petition and consent was filed with the Council to narrow a portion of North Drexel Avenue by vacating a strip of ground along the west side thereof, which strip of ground is described as follows:-

Being all that part of Drexel Avenue shown on the plat of Subdivision of the Estate of Anton Ruhl (Plat Book 8, page 7-a) and lying between Maryland Avenue and Ruhl Avenue, which lies West of a line 60 ft. west of and parallel to the East line of Drexel Avenue, between said streets, as shown on the plat of Second Ruhl Place, recorded in Plat Book 17, pages 104 and 105, and


WHEREAS, Council upon hearing finds that said petition and consent was signed by the owners of all the property abutting upon said portion of North Drexel Avenue so to be vacated and is further satisfied that there is good cause for said vacation as prayed for; that the same will result in making said street of uniform width by narrowing the same at the above mentioned point, and further finds that said vacation will not be detrimental to the general interests; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 1. That said portion of North Drexel Avenue be, and the same is hereby narrowed, and said above described tract of ground is hereby vacated.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
