

ORDINANCE NO. 12-41

By Mr. Betz

Providing penalty for removing danger warning devices.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Whoever shall unlawfully remove or carry away any lantern, light, sign, signal, barrier, or other device, placed by any officer or employee of the city, or by any contractor, his agent or employee, engaged upon a public improvement, or by any other person under authority of law or ordinance, as a warning or protection to the public against danger, or shall remove or carry away any barrier closing any street, alley or other highway to public traffic, shall upon conviction thereof be fined not to exceed \$50.00, together with the costs of prosecution.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
