

ORDINANCE NO. 48-41

By Mr. Stackhouse

Providing for the repair and maintenance of certain streets, roads and avenues in the City of Bexley, Ohio, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract or contracts, after advertisement according to law, for the purchase of the necessary bituminous materials and crushed stone for the surface treatment of various streets, road and avenues in the City of Bexley which may be in need of such treatment, during the year 1941, and to cause said work to be done under the directions and to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Streets and the engineers.

Section 2. That the entire cost of said repairs and surface treatment shall be paid from the Maintenance & Repair of Streets Gasoline Tax Fund, and the sum of \$2500.00 is hereby appropriated from that fund for the purpose of paying the cost of such materials, and the necessary engineering and expenses incident to said work.

Section 3. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance, and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace and safety, by reason of the fact that said streets are in need of immediate repair and in places becoming unsafe to traffic, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
