

ORDINANCE NO. 20-47

Prohibiting burning certain materials within the city, and providing penalty therefor.


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 1. No person shall burn or cause to be burned within the city any garbage, woolen, silk, leather, Indian rubber goods, or leaves, or other substances so that the same shall give rise to offensive odors or gases.

Section 2. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars, and shall pay the costs of prosecution.


Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
