

## ORDINANCE NO. 37-47

By Mr. Altmaier

Appropriating money for expenses of Recreation Board, and  
declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEKLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That whereas by reason of the temporary occupancy of the Jeffrey house by the nurses of the Children's Hospital it has become necessary for the Recreation Board to secure the use of certain facilities belonging to the Board of Education of the City schools for recreational purposes, which use has required and will continue to require the incurring of expenses for heat, light, janitor services, and other necessary expenses, the sum of \$250.00 is hereby appropriated from the general fund for that purpose, and the Auditor is authorized to issue proper vouchers in payment of bills rendered for such services, after approval thereof by the Director of Recreation or the Chairman of the Recreation Board.

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary in the daily operation of the Department of Recreation, and the same shall go into immediate force and effect.
