

ORDINANCE NO. 5-50

TO FIX THE PRICES TO BE CHARGED BY COLUMBUS AND SOUTHERN OHIO ELECTRIC COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, FOR RESIDENTIAL AND SMALL COMMERCIAL ELECTRIC SERVICE IN THE CITY OF BEXLEY, FRANKLIN CO., OHIO, DURING THE PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS FROM THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. For the period of five years from and after the effective date of this ordinance, the rates and prices which Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company, its successors and assigns (hereinafter called the "Company"), shall be entitled to charge for residential and small commercial electric service furnished to its consumers in the City of Bexley, Ohio, are hereby fixed at not to exceed the following:

RESIDENCE SERVICE
ALTERNATING ELECTRIC CURRENT
SERVICE

The service furnished under this schedule is alternating electric current, single phase, 60 cycles, 120-240 volts supplied through overhead distributing mains.

First	40 Kilowatt-hours consumed during any month,	4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per K.W.H.
Next	60 Kilowatt-hours consumed during the same month,	4¢ per K.W.H.
Next	60 Kilowatt-hours consumed during the same month,	3¢ per K.W.H.
All over	160 Kilowatt-hours consumed during the same month	2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per K.W.H.
	Minimum monthly bill, One Dollar	

OPTIONAL
RESIDENCE SERVICE
ALTERNATING ELECTRIC CURRENT

The service furnished under this schedule is alternating electric current, single phase, 60 cycles, 120-240 volts supplied through overhead distributing mains.

First	50 Kilowatt-hours consumed during any month,	6¢ per K.W.H.
Next	50 Kilowatt-hours consumed during the same month,	3¢ per K.W.H.
All over	100 Kilowatt-hours consumed during the same month,	2¢ per K.W.H.

RATES FOR SMALL COMMERCIAL SERVICE

AVAILABILITY

Available for small commercial light and power service to consumers using single phase, 60 cycles, 120-208 volts or 120-240 volts, and three phase, 60 cycles, 208, 220, or 440 volts, alternating current, supplied through overhead distributing mains.

RATES

First	25	Kilowatt-hours consumed during any month,	5¢ per K.W.H.
Next	25	Kilowatt-hours consumed during the same month,	4.5¢ per K.W.H.
Next	450	Kilowatt-hours consumed during the same month,	3¢ per K.W.H.
All over	500	Kilowatt-hours consumed during the same month,	2.5¢ per K.W.H.

Minimum monthly bill, One Dollar.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent commercial service consumers from electing to purchase electric service under the company's optional commercial service schedule applicable to said City, when filed with The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio.

Section 2. The Company has filed with The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio its complaint and appeal under Section 614-44 et seq. of the General Code of Ohio from an electric rate ordinance of the City of Columbus, Ohio, entitled

"AN ORDINANCE NO. 718-49: TO FIX THE PRICES TO BE CHARGED BY COLUMBUS AND SOUTHERN OHIO ELECTRIC COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS FOR ELECTRIC CURRENT IN THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, OHIO, DURING THE PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS FROM NOVEMBER 15, 1949, AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF THIS ORDINANCE TO THE VOTE OF THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, OHIO, AT THE ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 1949,"

which complaint, entered on the dockets of said Commission in Proceeding 21,106, is now pending before said Commission for the purpose of fixing and determining the just and reasonable rates and prices to be charged and collected by the Company for electric current in said City during said ordinance period.

In the event the schedule of residential rates, or the schedule of commercial rates applicable to the first 1000 K.W.H. per month, as finally fixed by said Commission or order of court in said Proceedings No. 21,106, whether by consent of the parties or otherwise, shall so differ from the schedules of rates contained in this Ordinance that the amount payable for service under said final schedules of rates would exceed or be less than the

amount payable for service under the schedules of rates contained in this ordinance, said final schedule of residential rates or schedule of commercial rates applicable to the first 1000 K. W. H. per month shall automatically, upon the date when they are finally fixed as aforesaid, supersede these ordinance schedules, regardless of the amount of energy consumed, for the remainder of the period of this ordinance next following such date, except that if said superseding schedules effect a reduction in the amount payable, said superseding schedules shall retroactively be effective to the effective date of this ordinance. In such latter case, the Company shall refund to the consumers affected by said superseding schedules, within eighteen months after said schedules become fixed as aforesaid, the differences between the amount previously collected under the superseded schedules and the amount payable under said superseding schedules. Refunds unclaimed at the end of said 18-month period may be retained by the Company.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after thirty days from its passage and shall apply to all monthly bills thereafter rendered, provided it has been assented to by said Company by written acceptance filed in the office of the City Clerk of said City of Bexley, Ohio on or before thirty days after its passage.
