An ordinance determining to proceed with the improvement of Astor Avenue, from Sheridan Avenue west a distance of approximately 225 feet in the City of Bexley, Ohio, by paving the roadway, constructing sidewalks and doing other work incidental thereto, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, FRANKLIN COUNTY, OHIO:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement in the City of Bexley of Astor Avenue from Sheridan Avenue west a distance of approximately 225 feet.

Section 2. That said improvement shall be made in accordance with the provisions of Resolution No. 3-64 passed on April 14, 1964, and with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles heretofore approved and now on file in the office of the clerk of this council for paving the roadway, constructing sidewalks, and doing other work incidental thereto.

Section 3. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom that have been legally filed shall be inquired into before the commencement of the proposed improvement, and the Solicitor is hereby authorized and directed to institute legal proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into claims that have been so filed.

Section 4. That the portion of the cost provided in the above mentioned resolution of necessity to be assessed, shall be assessed in the manner and the number of installments provided in said resolution and on lots and lands described therein.

Section 5. That the estimated assessments heretofore prepared and filed in the office of the clerk of this council be, and the same are, hereby adopted.

Section 6. The clerk of this council is hereby directed to deliver a certified copy of this ordinance to the county auditor within fifteen days after its passage.

Section 7. Subject to the provisions of R. C. 727.24, the mayor of the city is hereby authorized and directed as soon as the funds therefor are available, to make and execute a contract for said improvement with the lowest and best bidder, after advertising according to law and the improvement shall be financed as provided in the resolution of necessity.

Section 8. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of said city and for the further reason that the immediate construction of said improvement is necessary to eliminate existing hazards to pedestrian and vehicular traffic. Wherefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
