

ORDINANCE NO. 10 -71

Providing for the possible resurfacing and repairing of a street, curbs and gutters, in the City of Bexley, and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, limited funds are available for resurfacing and until the bids for other streets are opened, it is unknown whether or not there will be money available for Sheridan Avenue, now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That, whereas, the following street, to-wit:

Sheridan Avenue, from Main Street to Livingston Avenue,

is in need of repair so that the same may be maintained as a proper highway, said street shall be repaired by resurfacing the same with asphaltic concrete, and repairing the base and the curbs and gutters thereof, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles thereof heretofore to be prepared by the engineers and to be on file in the office of the Mayor.

Section 2. That the entire cost of said repairs shall be paid by the City.

Section 3. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract or contracts for said repairs after advertisement according to law, providing there is sufficient money available in the 1971 appropriation to pay for the same.

Section 4. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said street is fast deteriorating and becoming unsafe for traffic, and this ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect upon passage and approval by the Mayor.
