


ORDINANCE NO. 40-84

An ordinance to repeal the provisions of Ordinance 19-69 passed July 8, 1969 (Chapter 410, Codified Ordinances) regarding the establishment and operation of a Traffic Violations Bureau in The City of Bexley and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, this Council, as part of Ordinance 19-69, passed July 8, 1969, established a Traffic Violations Bureau to assist the Mayor's Court with the clerical work of traffic cases; and,

WHEREAS, this Council again as part of said Ordinance delineated the amount and procedure for the payment of certain traffic fines, the offenses which may be so handled, the maintenance of records of such procedures, and the reports of and disposition of the monies received; and,

WHEREAS, the Ohio Traffic Rules, as promulgated by The Ohio Supreme Court, and as amended effective August 4, 1980, mandated the establishment of a Traffic Violations Bureau by the Court, and further provided the specific authority of such Bureau and the procedures to be followed in the operation of such Bureau; and,

WHEREAS, the authority and procedures mandated by Rule 13, Ohio Traffic Rules, although similar in purpose, are sufficiently different to justify the creation of a new Bureau pursuant to an Order of the Mayor's Court, and the abolition of the existing statutory creation; NOW, THEREFORE,


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1: That the provisions of Ordinance 19-69, passed July 8, 1969, and codified as Chapter 410, Codified Ordinances of Bexley, relating to the establishment, supervision, duties, and operation of a Traffic Violations Bureau, should be and they are hereby repealed and held for naught.


Section 2: That all the provisions of Ordinance 19-60 not herein specifically identified and not relating to the operation of the Traffic Violations Bureau shall remain in full force and effect and be unaffected by this Ordinance.

Section 3: That this Ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, and shall go into effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.


