A Resolution to make the City of Bexley a City of Lights for Welcome and Hope.

WHEREAS, tradition has it that a candle placed in a window is a symbol of welcome for weary travelers and an outward sign of inner warmth; and,

WHEREAS, many can remember parents saying "I'll leave the light on until you get home"; and,

WHEREAS, light has long been a symbol of hope, dispelling the darkness of winter, and is known to have the power to diminish emotional distress; and,

WHEREAS, individuals continue to seek peace within their hearts, their families, their neighborhoods, and the nations of the world. NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That this Council does hereby support the YWCA Peace School's effort to spread the placing of an electric candle in a window as a sign of Welcome and Hope, and encourages our citizens to participate in this effort, making a visible statement that we desire to welcome home the people serving in the Gulf when that day comes, and that we continue to hope for peace and for the safety of the people of the Region.

Section 2. That lights will be made available at Bexley City Hall for distribution to anyone wishing to display a symbol of light and hope, and encourage Council to support this worthwhile endeavor.
