After review of the report and video of officer(s) involved, this pursuit is with-in policy. This pursuit stated ofter Sgt Glick observed a blacked out SUV on Mound St do a uturn in the intersection without lights on at 5am.

Sgt Glick turned and got behind the suspect vehicle and caught up to it at Francis and Livingston Ave. The Lincoln MKZ now had its lights on and immediately after given a audible and visual signal to stop, the SUV stopped and let out a rear passenger. The vehicle then fled southbound on College Ave at a high rate of speed, which Sgt Glick knew was too fast for the situation and he quickly disengaged. Sgt Glick returned back for the rear passenger that ran from the vehicle and that person was never found.

Sgt Glicks highest speed was 73mph on a five lane road with little to no traffic at the time.

Other leads have developed and a suspect, has been identified from a theft report and subsequent leads-on-line alerts.
